ENSHRINEMENT REQUIREMENT

To be considered for nomination to the Sports Hall of Fame, a prospective candidate must meet the following criteria:

- A. Attain prominence in either professional or amateur sports as a player, coach, manager, official, owner, writer or broadcaster.
- B. Have been a resident of Rockland County at the time of his or her prominence.
- C. Be a person of integrity and good character.
- D. A period of 5 years shall have elapsed since he or she gained prominence.

Nominations for consideration by the Hall of Fame Committee are solicited from the general public. Nominees are reviewed by the screening committee and then voted upon for enshrinement by the entire committee.



JOHN JEMISON

John Jemison's hometown is Mobile, Alabama, where he went to high school from 1963-1966. He moved to Rockland County in 1966 and immediately began what we now know as one of the most outstanding softball careers. When Jemison was in high school, he was also an outstanding football player. He played fullback on offense and linebacker on defense. He made All-County both times in the shot putt. This is where he developed his tremendous strength for throwing the softball. Jemison was a shot putt champion for Mobile, with his best heave of 52'6''. He has scholarship offers for college football but leg injuries preventing his playing. Instead, he headed north to Rockland, where he's been tormenting softball players for over 20 years.

John loves the game of softball as much as anyone, and most definitely more than most. You have to love the game in order to play as many games and with as many teams as John has. He usually plays with 4 to 6 teams per year and in 20 years averages pitching 130 games per year, including tournaments. John remembers the very best year he had as a pitcher, he won 98 and lost 3. When asked' what his won-lost record has been, it was almost impossible to remember how many games he's won each year. However, he can count on one hand the number of losses he's suffered in one year.

John has played with many softball teams in Rockland County. Just to name a few: Apollo XII, Villa Mt. Ivy, Nyack Cardinals, Tappan Zee Bar, Orange Lantern, Pal Chevrolet, Haverstraw Sports Club, Captain Video, Expert Roofing, Long John Silvers, F&F Lawnmower, and Brenner's Florsheim. He has also pitched in benefit games against the King and His Court, Oueen and Her Court, and C B S.

In 20 season John has 2,146 wins and 145 losses. Here are some other incredible pitching achievements; 54 non-hitters; 7 perfect games; 26 consecutive wins; 11 consecutive strike-outs; 18 strike-outs out of 21 in a 7 inning game; 10 no hitters in one season; 9 consecutive shut-outs; 80 consecutive scoreless innings; 5 team championships in one season; pitched 5 games in one day and won them all.

With Mt. Hope, John won 2 New Jesey State Championships which qualified his team for the U.S. Nationals. A very interesting story unfolds here. This is a slow pitch tournament of the highest caliber in the United States. When John took his warm-up pitches for the first game, the umpires and opposing team could not believe how fast he was throwing slow pitch style. The officials decided he must be illegal and sent him to pitch on the side lines while he was scrutinized by numerous officials from all different angles. In the meantime, the game had to go on, so his team had to use their second string pitcher. By the time the officials had decided if John was pitching legal (they made him throw 65 pitches), his team was losing their game and ended up in the loser's bracket. John was finally declared legal and he proceeded to pitch his team to first place in the loser's bracket division. While under scrutinization. John was clocked at 98 miles per hour SLOW PITCH!

Everyone knows what a great softball pitcher John Jemsion is, but few know what an outstanding hitter he is. His greatest game was when he went 4 for 4, all home runs and a walk for a 17 base total.

Graduate of the Columbia Unviversity College of Pharmacy in June, 1961. Registered Pharmacist in New York, New Jersey, Maine and Florida.

Judged amateur boxing from 1965 to 1967 including the New York Golden Gloves. Was appointed to the New York State Athletic Commission as a professional boxing judge in June 1967 by then Commissioner Edwin B. Dooley.

Eileen and I moved to Orangeburg, New York in 1968. We own our own home in Orangeburg (which was famous for Camp Shanks during World War II and Gus Wilsons Training Camp).

I was named judge of the year by Boxing Today Magazine in 1982. Have been the judge in at least 41 world championship fights, and am licensed by the WBA, EBC and the IBF. I am also licensed by the NABF and USBA.

I have judged fights in such places as Chile, Panama, Japan, Korea, Paris, Milan, San Remo (Italy), Venezuela,, Columbia, Argentina and throughout the United States.

Got interested in Boxing from my dad who was an avide fight fan and used to take me to the Long Beach Stadium every week during the summer months when I was very young. My father in law an inspector with the NY State Athletic Commission and he used to take Eileen and I to the fights during our college days. I have always considered myself a great fan of the sport.

I have the distinction of being a judge who was not a former fighter. I learned everything through experience and watching figures. i have always been a student of the game, and I try to correspond with people around the world to keep up on boxing news.




BOB MATHIAS

"BREAKS P.S.A.L. SCORING RECORD (53)"

With 3:32 left in Friday's Clarkstown North - Ramapo Basketball game, Bob Mathias grabbed a teammate's missed shot and put the basketball through the hoop for two points. That's not unusual - he's done it 424 other times in his 49-game varsity career at Clarkstown. What made it significant was the fact that it was his 53rd point of the game which broke the individual scoring record for a single high school game in Rockland County.

Off to a quick start, Mathias scored 18 points in the first quarter, 11 in the second, 12 third-quarter points and 12 in the fourth quarter to break the record (22-28 from the field and 9-11 from the foul line). The former record of 52 was set by Jim Malfetti, another former Clarkstown great, againt Nanuet in 1966.
