### ENSHRINEMENT REQUIREMENT

The Rockland County Sports Hall of Fame was established to honor outstanding professional and amateur sportsmen, living and deceased, who have gained prominence while residing in Rockland County. To be considered for nomination to the Sports Hall of Fame, a prospective candidate must meet the following criteria:

- A. Attain prominence in either professional or amateur sports as a player, coach, manager, official, owner, writer or broadcaster.
- B. Have been a resident of Rockland County at the time of his or her prominence.
- C. Be a person of integrity and good character.
- D. A period of 5 years shall have elapsed since he or she gained prominence.

Nominations for consideration by the Hall of Fame Committee are solicited from the general public. Nominees are reviewed by the screening committee and then voted upon for enshrinement by the entire committee.



### STEVE DRUMMOND

Steve Drummond has been actively involved in the Rockland County sports scene for over 30 years - as an athlete, official, and writer.

#### BASEBALL

- <u>CLARKSTOWN HIGH SCHOOL</u> All-County pitcher junior and senior years. Captain senior year. Starting outfielder on PSAL championship team sophomore year. Hit .364.
- CONNIE MACK LEAGUE Pitched West Haverstraw Masonics to New York State championship, winning 4 straight games. Pitched 9 innings of no-hit baseball in Eastern Regionals. Struck out 19 batters in 7-inning game, 21 in a 9-inning game.
- <u>C.W. POST COLLEGE</u> Small college All-American. Set 6 school records season ERA (0.50), strikeouts in a game (17) and season (96), innings pitched in a season (93 2/3), complete games in a season (8) and career shutouts (4) which still stands. 2-year record of 15-3 on teams with 20-15 overall record. Team MVP on team that included future major league all-star Richie Scheinblum.

### **FOOTBALL**

- 3-Year starter, captain senior year. All-County senior year. Completed 55% of passes senior year and set then county record as a safety by intercepting 12 passes in 8 games.
- -Quarterbacked and coached Andy's Men's Wear to Rockland County Touch Football League championship.

### BASKETBALL

- All-County and captain senior year, eighth leading scorer in County. Starter on PSAL championship team junior year.

### **BOWLING**


- 1967 Rockland County Men's singles champion; 1961 Rockland Scholastic Golden Pins champion.


### LEWIS BRUNDAGE

During the 40's and 50's Pearl River High School had a very rich athletic tradition. Much of this was due to the presence of some outstanding individual performers. When it came to football, there was never a more dominant player than Lew Brundage. For three years, in the late 40's and early 50's, the name of Lew Brundage was synonomous with power football. When only a sophomore, one Journal News reporter, who proved to be quite prophetic when he noted, "Lew Brundage is a Pirate leather lugger headed for the hall of fame. He has stepped in and become a star in his own right."

For his efforts as a sophomore, Lew was selected to the All-County second team. In 1949 Lew dominated the County football scoring race

and was a unanimous choice to the All-County first team. He repeated his efforts in his senior year, when he was third in the county in scoring, again a unamimous selection to the first team.

Lew remained active in football for a number of years after high school. To this day, in fact, Lew remains active in football by coaching the very successful Pirate Alumni football team that plays before a packed stadium each Thanksgiving morning. Lew brundage's speed and strength as well as his athletic accomplishments have made him a legend in Pearl River football history.



### THE LATE JOHNNY BURNS

Johnny Burns was quite a guy when you look back. He was a Godsend to the children at Letchworth Village. He came to the Haverstraw sports scene when we needed him the most. The 32 years he served at Letchworth from 1925 to 1957 included the time of the Great Depression and the upheaval of World War II. Not only did Johnny help the patients at Thiells, but he helped the youngsters in the surrounding area. His good influence was felt far and wide.

Many people came to Letchworth and helped Johnny both in and out of the institution. He made "connections" everywhere. And they all helped him like a priest because people knew his reasons for asking were unselfish.

Johnny got the Big Five into Sing Sing to play a team of prisoners. He seemed to have a feeling for bringing class to athletic events, and his Big Five reflected it. The players were chosen for their ability and it was a real honor, which was never abused.

As season followed season, other basketball greats came along with Joseph "Bunny" DuCharme as a mainstay for years. And the honor roll of the Big Five was star studded with Has Evans, Bill Drescher, Max Friedman, Billy Babcock, Joe and Wilbur Ryan, Rocky Morano, Hawk Jacobs, Al and Mike Ryan, Tim Ryder, Sham and Butch Feeney, and Billy Kohut, naming only some of the great hoopsters who perfomed for the Big Five.

Besides his many activities at Letchworth, Johnny Burns was a born promoter, but always without thought of personal gain. In the 1930's he organized and directed a swim across the Hudson contest.

In cooperation with the businessmen of Haverstraw, Burns organized the race across the widest spot on the Hudson. He had first organized a swimming contest across the Great South Bay in Long Island when he was living in Bay Shore. Another athletic activity supervised by Johnny and the late Euclid Ganson was the annual race to the High Tor and back. It started and finished at the Haverstraw post office, opposite the tavern operated by Mike Hylas, like Johnny Burns, a boxing and athletic devotee all his life.

Johnny also organized, but never exploited the children at Letchworth. His minstrel shows were something to behold. Johnny was the interlocutor, adopting the jokes and the acts to the surroundings. One of his early "show biz" triumphs was the Calypso Band. Building on the rhythm training of Mrs. Sarah Flynn and the other teachers, Johnny trained a band in the music of the islands. He got help from other Letchworth folk along the line, but Johnny was the driving force. The Calypso Band, appearing every year in the Waldorf Astoria, got lots of publicity and volunteer support for Letchworth Village. They appeared on television, in other hospitals and for other benefits.



### PETER HAUBNER

Pete Haubner is one of only five Rockland County athletes who have been chosen as "Athlete of the Year" in the Rockland, Bergen and Fairfield tri-county area. Pete is also a member of the Spring Valley High School Hall of Fame.

While attending Spring Valley High School, Pete earned Varsity Letters in Football, Basketball and Track in his sophomore, junior and senior years (1964-1967).

While on the Football team, Pete was named All-County Quarterback in 1965 and 1966, when he was also the team captain. At one point, Pete threw four touchdown passes in a single game.

In Basketball, Pete served as team captain in 1967, leading Spring Valley to the county championship. In 1967 he was named All-County. He was also Rockland County M.V.P. and was on the first team, All-Metropolitan New York. He also received Honorable Mention on the R.C. Cola All-American Team. In that year, Pete averaged 20 points, 10 assists and 7 rebounds per game.

In track, Pete again excelled. He was named as an All-County High

Jumper in 1965 and 1966.

Upon graduating from Spring Valley High School, Pete enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps. He served in Vietnam for 13 months, where he was awarded two Purple Hearts and was twice decorated with The Republic of South Vietnam's Cross of Gallantry.

In college, Pete continued his outstanding athletic career. While attending Rockland Community College, Pete was team captain of the 1970 Basketball team. He averaged 25 points, 9 assists and 5 rebounds

per game and was named First Team, All-Region.

Pete attended C.W. Post College in 1972 and 1973, where he continued to play Basketball. He capped off his college athletic career by serving as team captain on the 1973 team which was nationally ranked among the top ten teams. That year, Pete averaged 12 points, 7 assists and 7 rebounds per game.

Pete lives in Suffern with his wife, Ondrea, and their two daughters, Alyson and Danielle.



### ETHEL DOLLER

Ethel Doller has been a member of the Rockland County Women's Bowling Association since its beginning in 1950. She was a member of the R.C.W.B.A. Board for 35 years. During that time, she held the following offices:

- Sergeant-At-Arms Director 1st Vice-President
- 2nd Vice-President President (22 years)

While a member of the R.C.W.B.A., she was chairman of the Bowlers Victory Legion for four years, which raised money for the veterans of Rockland County. She also served on R.C.W.B.A.'s Legislation, By-Laws Nominating and Tournament Committees.

Over the years, she served as President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary and Sgt.-At-Arms in the leagues she has participated and is presently participating.

Ethel is a life member of the R.C.W.B.A. and N.Y.S.W.B.A. Ethel is a charter member of the Rockland County Junior Bowling Association for which whe served as Tournament Chairman, Vice-President, and has been President for over 15 years. She has been a coach and a Certified Coach Instructor for 25 years.

Ethel is also a Charter member of the Rockland County Woman's 600 Club and served as Vice-President for 10 years. She is presently a member of Emeritus of the 600 club.

Ethel is a member of the Rockland County Sports Hall of Fame for 15 years and has been its secretary for the last 5 years. Ethel is also a charter member of the Rockland County Bowling Council. She served as treasurer the first two years of its organizing and since then as secretary to the president. She has been Tournament Director of the Rockland County Junior Scholarship Fund Tournament for the past two years.

Ethel has been on four R.C.W.B.A. Tournament team winners. She won King & Queen Tournament with Dick Schraeder and the Golden Pins Mixed Doubles Tourney with Steve Linzeabald. She has participated in several National and New York State Tournaments. Her high game is 276 and high series 658.



**DOMINIC GAMBOLI** 

Dominic "Babe" Gamboli was born into competition. He had to compete with five brothers who were all sports enthusiasts. At the age of 7, he was considered the best checker player in Haverstraw. The six Gamboli brothers were the best bowling family in the county. As a team, they rolled in International Bowling Tournaments sponsored by the American Bowling Congress. They came in first and Babe was the anchor man. The brothers won 20 of 21 matches in New York and New Jersey. Babe, the youngest of the clan and the third member of the Gamboli family selected to the Hall of Fame, started as a pin boy and, at the age of 16, averaged 197. He was the first winner of the E.J. Maurer Golden Pins Tournament.

While in high school, Babe lettered in baseball, basketball and football. He was a member of the first football team at Haverstraw High School, where he played guard. Prior to serving in World War II, he played in the Rockland County Baseball League with the Knights of Columbus and other Semi-pro teams. He was noted as a good fielder fair hitter. His nickname "Babe" did not come from Babe Ruth.

Perhaps his greatest prominence came about in Little League Baseball. In 1952, Babe was one of the organizers of Little League Baseball in Haverstraw. In '52, '53, and '54, he was the manager of the Red Sox. His team won the Championship in '53 and '54. In 1953, he was the first All-Star Manager. That team was defeated by Schenectady, which was the team that went on to win the Little League World Series in Williamsport. The pitcher that defeated Haverstraw was Billy Connors, Coach of the New York Yankees. From 1956 to 1965 Babe was the League President. During that period the Haverstraw Little League became know throughout the State. The reputation of its organization, manicured field and winning teams was unequalled and the league was used as a model throughout the Country. In '66 and '67 Babe stepped down to Vice President and returned as President in '68 and '69. Thus, in the forty year history of the Haverstraw Little League, Babe was President for twelve years and Vice President for two.

In 1974, Babe took over as District 18 Administrator in charge of all Little Leagues in Rockland. Through the years he has represented Rockland at the Little League Congress and was responsible for the passage of the 2-inning rule which insures that all boys and girls must play at least two innings in every game. Little League is an all-year round effort for Babe and it reaches its heights during July and August, which is All-Star Tournament time and the Annual Journal-News Little League Tournament of Champions for the benefit of Camp Jawonio, the Rockland Center for the Physically Handicapped. This event has raised over \$100,000 for the benefit of Jawonio.

Babe has dedicated himself to serving the Youth of his community and the County. A quiet man who has always spoken softly, his deeds have spoken for him.

Babe is known as "Mr. Little League" in Rockland County. His love for sports, young people, good clean competition, and service to his community is his legacy.






