

Congratulations to two outstanding New York State championship teams, the 1990-91 Albertus Magnus girls' basketball team that went 23-3, led by Coach Lorraine Moylan, and the 1981-82 Spring Valley boys' basketball team with a record of 22-5, led by the late Lou Kliewe. Both teams had an arduous task of building success through tough losses and ultimately getting to the promised land. It is a great honor that in our 46th anniversary year we induct two

top-notch teams into the Rockland County Sports Hall of Fame. This is a tradition that we will continue each year at a Rockland Boulders baseball game.

We are also inducting Gene Dall, a legendary track and cross-country coach for North Rockland who coached the Red Raiders for 47 seasons. As is our custom at Rockland Boulders games, we will be raising funds for an individual who is in need of financial help due to serious injury or illness. This year we will be raising funds for Will McCue, a New City volunteer firefighter and former varsity athlete at Clarkstown North High School, class of 2016, who had both hands and feet amputated as a result of complications suffered when he contracted the flu in January 2018. Will still needs extensive therapy and care in his rehabilitation.

A team to remember

Memories of Albertus' climb to the top



Watching a team like Albertus Magnus building to this year's girls' state Class B and state Federation champions brings back many memories.

No overnight flash in the pan were these winning Falcons. It took three years of building, and oldfashioned hard work to bring home Rockland's first girls' state public and Federation basketball titles.

I've been covering this team for three years. I watched coach Lorraine Moylan set the foundation in the 1988-89 season, add to it in 1989-90 and finally complete the masterpiece this season.

I can still see the 1989 Section 1 Class B semifinal loss to Our Lady of Lourdes. I have visions of Kelli Dunlay's great inside moves, and a tearful Jennifer Feeney each time she moved her injured knee. It was a tough way to end the 20-3 season. but it was all part of the building process.

That season saw the nucleus of Feeney, Kim Behrens, Eileen Mc-Cabe, Jamie McCullough, and Maragaret Feerick come together for the first time. They may not have known it then, but they were just two years away from glory. Dunlay and Feeney were All-County selections and Moylan was the Coach of the Year, but it was all part of the building process.

Helene Herlihy, brought up for the 1989 playoffs, would become a starter on the 1989-90 team and another piece of the puzzle was in place. Kathy Murphy also joined the team that same year, in which-Trish Ahern, Hope Krug, and Christine Berry all became integral parts of a 25-2 team.

when Albertus's dreams of a state title vanished in less than eight minutes to Nottingham of Syracuse.

Feeney, Behrens and Ahern were All-County selections; Feeney was a first-team, All-State player; Behrens made third team; and Movlan took home her second straight Coach of the Year plaque. And it was all part of the building process.

This 1990-91 season was, by design, a power schedule and it opened on a high note with a 58-57 win over eventual state Class A champ John Jay of East Fishkill. A basket by Feerick in the closing seconds sealed the win.

The Falcons swept Clarkstown North and Clarkstown South to win the Albertus Holiday Tournament, then suffered their first loss of the season to defending state Class A champ Shenendehowa. One bad quarter did the Falcons in, the last lapse of the season.

A resounding 68-44 win over Holy Angels, a New Jersey state Class B finalist last season, followed but that euphoria was quickly tempered by a 75-53 loss to Christ the King, last season's state, Federation, and USA Today poll champs. Albertus played CTK even for a half, and it was all part of the building process.

The pattern continued with a 67-50 win over state-ranked Bishop Kearney of Brooklyn in a game in which Behrens scored a season-high 22 points. That was followed by the third and final loss of the season, to St. Joseph Hill of Staten Island, 61-I was around to watch tears of 56. It was the only Class B loss of

After waltzing through the Section 1-B playoffs and annexing its second straight 1-B title, Albertus won the Capital District B final, 63-49, in a rematch with Section 9 champ and one-girl team Monticello. That would be used later in the state and Federation finals as another step to complete the building process.

Albertus's state final was anticlimactic after the semifinal rematch with three-time defending state champ Nottingham. After squeaking out the 58-56 win, Aquinas of Rochester was almost a letdown. Aquinas was another onegirl team and the Falcons' 1-3-1 zone defense held that girl in check. Then it was on to a rematch with St. Joseph in the Federation final, and revenge time.

In the end, St. Joseph became a one-girl team, Albertus employed its lessons learned, and the rest is county history.

I will forever remember when Feeney picked up her first foul of the entire playoff march from the 1-B final to the Federation title. It was 6:21 of the third quarter against St. Joe's. What a string. I can never forget Feerick's clutch shooting in that final, or Herlihy's off-the-bench steals all season.

I can still see McCullough's Herculean 22-point effort against Christ the King. And I can still hear Mc-Cabe whispering in my ear after the Monticello game that she wasn't really 5-foot-10, but 5-8. It was our little secret the rest of the way.

Three years of hard work realized. Three years of building to a resounding championship crescendo. Three years of memories that I, and Rockland, will not soon forget. Thanks. It's been my pleasure.

Pearl River High School Class of 1976

Inducted in 2014...Lorraine Moylan applied the lessons she learned on the basketball court in a record-setting coaching career at Albertus Magnus and her alma mater, Pearl River. In her 30 years of coaching girls' basketball, Lorraine won 21 league titles, 6 Section 1 championships, 5 Regional crowns, 2 New York State titles and 2 State Federation championships. She wound

up with 536 career victories, a record for a Rockland basketball coach, boys or girls, and No. 2 all-time in Section 1 girls' basketball behind Gina Maher of Irvington. Lorraine's overall mark of 536 victories and only 140 losses works out to a stellar winning percentage of 79.3%.

Born in the Bronx, Lorraine moved to Pearl River when she was in the second grade. After she graduated from Pearl River High School in 1976, she earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Central Connecticut State University and a master's degree in adaptive physical education from Long Island University. She played basketball throughout her elementary, high school and college careers.

Lorraine began her basketball coaching career as a JV coach at Spring Valley High School, followed by an assistant coaching stint at Mercy College in Westchester County. In 1983 she began her head coaching career at Albertus Magnus, where she led the Falcons to back-to-back New York State and Federation Class B championships in 1990-1991 and 1991-92. She returned to her alma mater in 1993 as a physical education teacher and varsity basketball coach. Lorraine retired as a coach after the 2012-13 season and continues to teach physical education.

"I have been blessed to have had so many excellent assistant coaches, and so many great players over the years," says Lorraine, who also coached JV soccer and softball at both Pearl River and Albertus and JV softball at Spring Valley. "They have inspired me to always strive to excel in every aspect of my life. They have taught me that the journey together is what is truly most important, not the destination."

As a young player Lorraine received guidance, fundamental training and support from the late Steve Baxter, her coach at St. Margaret's in CYO ball, and her brother Jack Guerci – "he's the one who developed my competitive spirit," she says. Her coaching influences included her mentor at Central Connecticut, Brenda Reilly; Carol Schachner Leib, under whom Lorraine served as assistant coach at Mercy; and Tom Collins, the Hall of Fame former boys' coach at Albertus Magnus who served as AD at both Albertus and Pearl River.

Lorraine coached many outstanding players during her three- decade tenure, but any listing of her top protégés would have to include, at Albertus: the Feeney sisters, Jen, MaryBeth and Kathleen; the Feerick sisters, Margaret and Pat; Kim Behrens, and Eileen King. At Pearl River, her premier performers included Betsy McManus, Kelly McManus, Kaitlin O'Keefe, Kait Page, Christa and Missy Scognamiglio, Kelly Mulligan and Nicole Grossbard. When you've had much success as Lorraine has, it's not easy singling out one or two games as the most memorable, but she rates the second state championship with Albertus as one of the top accomplishments in her personal highlight reel. In that game, the Falcons edged Queensbury on its home court in a down-to-the-wire thriller. Both of the Section 1 championships she won at Pearl River remain special, too, and "the icing on the cake" was reaching the State final four coaching her alma mater.

Lorraine resides in Park Ridge, N.J., with her husband, Jamie; daughter Annie, a second-grade teacher in Fair Lawn, N.J., and son Billy.

Lorraine pays tribute to all of her assistant coaches "for their tireless efforts and dedication to the programs," especially Nancy Brezovsky, Kait Page, Tricia Flynn, Kathleen Finnegan and Brenda King. "I would also like to thank all of the former players for their blood, sweat and tears," she says. "They are the reason I am receiving this honor."

The Spring Valley boys basketball team. New York State Class A public school champions this past season, were honored Friday at a luncheon given by state Sen. Linda Winikow and Assemblyman Eugene Levy.

Levy. The two Rockland officials play host to 40 players, coaches, school officials and administrators at the Holiday Inn in Nanuet. Each member of the state championship team received a trophy inscribed with the youngster's name and decorated in the black and orange school colors.

In addition. Mrs. Winikow read a letter of tribute from Gov Hugh L. Carey and Levy presented a handsome plaque on which was a framed copy of the resolution from the New York State Legislature commending the team for its performance during the state tournament. Mrs. Winikow also presented an engraved plaque to school officials for the Tiger trophy case.

In his remarks, Levy said, "Linda and I wanted to something more for the team. We wanted to show our appreciation for what they did for Spring Valley and what they did for Rockland. We wanted to congratulate a team that has gone all the way."

Levy related to the youngsters his experiences as co-captain of the Spring Valley basketball team in 1943. "We were 4-12 that year but you could say we were spirited."

Mrs. Winikow also related her basketball experiences. "I played in college and when I went to the State Senate eight years ago, I found out they had a legislative team called the Albany Mallers. I sent back a form saying I wanted to play. I bought myself an outfit, worked out and said I wanted to join. "They were surprised and told me they didn't have facilities for women players. I insisted and had two practices and one game. The game was almost a problem. We were going to play shirts and skins, but when I showed up to play, we had to change plans slightly. We were shirts."

Dr. Jack Anderson, superintendent of the East Ramapo School District, commented, "Our total community has been uplifted by your achievement. Wear that recognition proudly."

Anderson also informed the players that they would be receiving state championship jackets.

Head coach Lou Kliewe paid tribute to his players and assistant coaches and expressed particular appreciation for those who had planned the luncheon. His remarks were echoed by Spring Valley principal Burt Caplan, who said, "I want to thank you guys for being not only champions, but gentlemen.' Your actions in Glens Falls, both on and off the court, brought great credit to Spring Valley. You created a sense of excitement and pride that will long be remembered."

That sense of excitement was most noticeable at the end of the luncheon when it was time for desert. The Holiday Inn staff provided a table of "make your own sundaes" with three gallons of ice cream, four kinds of syrup, cherries, sprinkles, walnuts, pineapple, and other toppings.

The Spring Valley boys entered the room as basketball champions. They left as undisputed champions of the ice cream sundae competition. The desert table took a bigger licking than Bishop Ludden had in the state championship game.

Inducted in 1998...lifelong Pearl River resident, graduated from Pearl River HS in early 1950s...winningest coach in Rockland scholastic boys' basketball history with 447 victories, amassed over a 35 year career, the first 7 at Albertus Magnus, then 28 at Spring Valley...his 1981-82 Spring Valley team won the NYS Class A championship, the only Rockland boys team ever to win a state title...his teams captured 12 league championships and four Section 9 crowns...he was honored as Rockland Coach of the Year 10 times...from 1978 to 1981 his Spring valley teams won 44 league games in

a row...his 1963-64 Albertus club went 18-1...for Spring Valley, his 1972-73 team went 18-1, the 1973-74 squad went 20-2, and the 1979-80 team 21-1...at Albertus, he served as athletic director and started the baseball, basketball and cross-country teams at the school...also was the longtime athletic director at Spring Valley...as an athlete at Pearl River, he was a first team All-County center fielder and twice a second team All-County guard in basketball... as an athletic director at Spring Valley he introduced girls' athletics in the early 1970s.

GENE DALL North Rockland Coach

During Eugene J. Dall's coaching career at North Rockland, his cross country and track & field teams have won, as of May 16, 2015: 48 League championships, 48 Rockland County championships, 40 Section championships, 18 individual New York State championships, and had two National individual champions.

And you thought North Rockland was a football school!

Gene Dall has been honored as Rockland County's top coach of the season 41 times.

Collecting hardware, though, has never been the main focus of Gene's career at Rockland County's largest high school. Recognizing, recruiting, training and preparing young men for the highest level of achievement on and off the track has always been the passion of this consummate physical education professional and coach.

A graduate of New Milford High School in New Jersey in 1965, Gene went on to Ithaca College, earning bachelor's and master's degrees in physical education. It's not surprising that he joined Ithaca's pantheon of excellent coaches (including North Rockland football legend Joe Casarella and our own Joe Biddy of Suffern) very early in his career. As an undergraduate, Gene coached wrestling at South Seneca High School, then guided the Trumansburg High football and track squads during his graduate student days.

Yes, Gene Dall knows football. All Twin-County Conference at New Milford, he wore the blue and white for the Ithaca Bombers in college, earning letters in track & field at both schools, too. Once Gene joined the P.E. faculty at North Rockland High School in 1970, Athletic Director Ralph Cordisco quickly put him to work with the freshman squad, where he racked up 47 wins and only 9 losses over seven years.

But when the seasons changed in 1970 so did the direction of North Rockland track & field and the county's history. Taking over the stagnant program, Gene's charges went 3-8 in dual meets in 1971 (his only losing season), then surely established the Red Raiders' dynasty. An 8-3 record and third place in the Rockland County championships in 1972 eventually led to the program's first county title in 1980. Along the way, North Rockland's boys assembled a 46-meet winning streak in dual meets between 1983 and 1993, an overall 45-year dual meet record of 249-33, and fought hard for 27 county and 18 sectional titles. The team was unbeatable between 2002 and 2007 as it triumphed in six straight county championship meets.

As we all know, few track & field athletes show up in mid-March and soar to great heights. Champions are built in the winter and that's exactly what Gene did as he thoroughly established the credibility of North Rockland's indoor track & field program. (They used to call it "winter track" as veterans of the old Red Raider Relays, contested on the high school's parking lot, will recall.) Running in the halls, sprinting around the oval painted in the parking lot, doing what could be done on the long-forgotten cinder track, as well as throwing and jumping in the gym, when necessary, produced 16 Rockland County and 20 Sectional titles during the snow-and-ice season.

If you're trying to do the math, you may be confused that all these numbers so far don't quite add up. That's because in September 1977 the world first saw what must have seemed very strange: Gene Dall stomping around Bear Mountain, Van Cortlandt Park, Sunken Meadow and other hilly, leaf-covered venues on Saturday afternoons without a pigskin in sight. Yes, Gene took over coaching North Rockland's cross country squad. The first season, the team went undefeated, winning Rockland County and Section 9 titles, and running in the New York State championships. More success followed with a Section 9 trophy in 1979 followed by third places in the state and Eastern States meets. Hall of Fame inductee Todd Sinclair's second place in the 1979 Federation Championships capped off Gene's first stint with the harriers.

Returning in 1984, Gene had the Red Raiders humming again as the program soared to new heights, capturing Section 1 titles in 1988, 1991, 2001 and 2002 that led to runner-up state meet placings in 1991 and 2002.

New York State championships were cherished but not especially rare things by the beginning of the 21st century as athletes coached by Gene and expert assistants (including longtime throws genius, the late Robert Murphy) brought home 18 state championships. That roster includes John Stephens in the shot put and pole vaulter Ryan Dall, Gene's son – both National champions; as well as Eric Favors, the current state champion and indoor shot put record holder.

The distinguished legacy of Gene Dall's 47 years at North Rockland not only includes plenty of victories, plaques and high-achieving young men, but also the origination of the challenging Red Raider Run cross country invitational and the massive, two-day Red Raider Relays held at the school's revamped track & field facility.

Gene now resides in Kingsville, Texas, with his wife, Lonnie. Gene assists his son Ryan, who is head coach of the track team at Texas A&M-Kingsville, a Division II school. They hosted the Div. II national championships in April of this year and Gene played a major role in administering the meet.

ENSHRINEMENT REQUIREMENTS

The Rockland County Sports Hall of Fame was established to honor outstanding sportsmen and sportswomen, living and deceased, who have gained prominence while residing or competing in, or have brought recognition to Rockland County. To be considered for nomination to the Hall of Fame, candidates must meet the following criteria:

- A. Attain prominence in sports as an athlete, coach, manager, official, owner, writer, broadcaster or supporter.
- B. Reside or have resided in Rockland County, competed here at the time of their prominence, or brought fame to Rockland County as a result of their accomplishments.
- C. Be a person of integrity and good character.
- D. Candidates cannot be considered until 10 years after their high school class graduation, except in special cases.
- E. Outstanding Team Award

The Hall of Fame shall accept nominations for an Outstanding Team Award. This award shall be made from time to time as the Board shall decide. The purpose of the Outstanding Team Award is to honor an entire Rockland County team in any sport in a single season that, by its team efforts, and its playing together as a team, has brought honor and acclaim to all of its members whether or not any of the individual members have achieved outstanding individual prominence. The criteria for the Outstanding Team Award shall be as follows:

- a. Members of the team must have been Rockland County residents at the time of their prominence or must have brought fame and recognition to Rockland because of their sports prominence.
- b. All members of the team shall be persons of integrity and good character.
- c. Unless waived by the unanimous vote of the Board, the team shall have been constituted as such and shall have played together not less than five (5) years prior to the time of their nomination.
- d. The board shall determine, on a year-by-year basis, whether a recipient or recipients shall be chosen in a given year from among those nominated.

Our committee encourages the public to send athletic resumes/nominations of prospective candidates to Screening and, if accepted, voted upon for enshrinement by the committee as a whole.

The Hall of Fame Committee holds monthly meetings the first Tuesday of the month from October to May. Anyone wishing to join the organization should write to Chairman Pete Scheibner, 1 Captain McGovern Drive, Stony Point, N.Y. 10980, or e-mail him at scheibnp@msn.com.

Each inductee in the Rockland County Sports Hall of Fame receives a commemorative trophy and is further honored with an individual plaque, which is given to the inductee's high school for public display.

The Rockland County Sports Hall of Fame is more than awards and trophies and dinners, however. It is really about people – Rockland County people who have had an impact in the world of sports. A total of 276 such individuals have been honored since the hall's inception in 1974.

The Hall of Fame has evolved from those early beginnings to become a recognized presence in Rockland County athletics. In addition to its annual dinner, where it honors new inductees, the hall makes sizable donations to worthwhile local organizations and charities.
